Remove SELINUX context from all files (the dot):

```
find / -exec setfattr -h -x security.selinux {} \;
```

Move the last 1000 files to a different location:

```
ls -a1 | tail -n1000 | xargs -i mv {} ./location
```

Count the number of files in a directory:

```
ls | wc -l
```

AWK out some characters:

little test script...

```
cat > test.sh << "EOF"
#!/bin/bash
DSK=$(findmnt -n -o SOURCE /boot | awk '{ print substr($0,1,8) }')
printf "\n${DSK}\n\n"
EOF
```

The print substr is looking at (string, start, count).

\$0 (provided string), 1 (starting point in the string), 8 (how many more to display after the starting point)
